2. Composition/information of ingredients

3. First aid measures

GENERAL

In all cases of doubt or when symptoms persist, seek medical attention. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

EYE CONTACT

Contact lenses should be removed. Irrigate copiously with clean, fresh water for at least 10 mins, holding the eyelids apart. Seek medical advice.

SKIN CONTACT

INGESTION

If accidentally swallowed, obtain immediate medical attention. Keep at rest. Do NOT induce vomiting.

EXTINGUISHING MEDIA

Recommended: Carbon dioxide, Dry Powder, Halogenated Hydrocarbons, Sand, Foam.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR FIRE FIGHTING PERSONNEL

Will not burn until all water has evaporated. Cool closed containers exposed to fire with a water spray. Do not allow run off from fire fighting to enter drains or water courses.

5. Accidental release measures

Contain and collect spillages with non-combustible absorbent materials (e.g. sand, earth) and place in suitable container for disposal in accordance with the waste regulations. Clean preferably with a detergent, avoid use of solvents.

6. Storage and handling

STORAGE

Observe the label precautions. Store between 5°C & 25°C in a dry, well-ventilated place away from sources of heat, ignition and direct sunlight. No smoking. Prevent unauthorised access. Containers which are opened should be properly resealed and kept upright to prevent leakage. Store away from oxidising agents and strongly alkaline or acid materials.

HANDLING

Avoid skin and eye contact. For personal protection see Section 7. Good housekeeping, regular maintenance of spray booth filters, and regular removal of waste materials will minimise risks.

ENGINEERING MEASURES

Provide adequate ventilation. Where reasonably practicable, this should be achieved by using local exhaust ventilation and good general extraction.

9. Stability & reactivity

Stable under the recommended storage & handling conditions (see Section 6). In the event of fire, refer to Section 4.

10. Toxicological information

There is no data available on the product itself. Splashes in the eyes may cause irritation and reversible local damage. Long-term experience of handling this class of product indicates the absence of any chronic acute effects.

GENERAL PROTECTION

All ppe, including rpe, used to control exposure to hazardous substances must be selected to meet the requirements of the COSHH regulations.

RESPIRATORY PROTECTION

When spraying, do not breathe spray. Wear suitable respiratory protective equipment.

HAND PROTECTION

Full physical protection is best. Seek relevant advice from glove manufacturer. Barrier cream may be of help but should not be applied after exposure has occurred.

EYE PROTECTION

Eye protection designed to protect against liquid splashes should be worn.

SKIN PROTECTION

Cotton or cotton/synthetic overalls or coveralls are normally suitable. Grossly contaminated clothing should be removed and the skin washed with soap and water or a proprietary skin cleaner.
